

Dear Friends and Benefactors,

Since our last newsletter we had a meaningful Christmas holiday season at the Heritage Living Center. Despite a blizzard bringing sub zero temperatures and three foot snowdrifts, the elders stayed warm and enjoyed their traditional Christmas blessings and prayers.

It seems like only yesterday when I first arrived at St. Labre Mission in 1954. I faced the difficult challenge of turning this struggling facility into a school with a strong foundation. We accomplished this without federal or state funds. After I retired from St. Labre in 1994, I was grateful that due to many generous benefactors, we left it financially secure and well endowed. Today, St. Labre continues as an outstanding leader in the field of Indian Education.

In 1997, I found many old 1970s tape recordings in the Cheyenne language. Among the many historical interviews, a tape recording

was discovered of an old chiefs' meeting. These were

men who had been my mentors when I first came to the reservation. They were lamenting the fate of their elders who were being sent to nursing homes far from the


reservation. These elders couldn't communicate in English and because transportation problems existed for family members, they rarely visited. Soon the elders became depressed, stopped eating and died far from their homelands. While listening to the recordings with Bisco Spotted Wolf, one of the chief's said: "Let's talk to Father Emmett. He will help us!" It seemed they were speaking to me from beyond the grave.

Their words haunted me into action. After much prayer, I rededicated my vow to provide care for Cheyenne elders. With great faith that "Maheo," our Creator God, would bless this new undertaking, I founded a non-profit charity called Soaring Eagle, dedicated to one main focus – the construction of an assisted living home for Chevenne elders.

The Heritage Living Center, built on a hill overlooking the historic Northern Cheyenne Reservation and the picturesque Tongue River Valley, was dedicated on August 31, 2002. Again,

benefactors for helping us today and in the future keeps us inspired to carry on. We depend upon your continued generosity to help us provide for the elders' daily needs and to make the mortgage payments each month. I am filled with gratitude for your support in making the old chiefs' vision a reality.



The year 2003 ended with heavy snow and sub-zero weather.

We don't have a long mailing list or an endowment like larger charities. Limited in what we can do; some necessities must wait additional funding, such as the 14 passenger, diesel-powered medical bus with a wheel-chair lift. This remains a top priority. A bus would eliminate the current use of multiple small vehicles to transport elders to clinic visits or to the hospital.

Last year your generous gifts made possible the much needed deep water well for the fire protection that we didn't have when fire swept over the hills right above the Center. When spring weather allows, the dam and reservoir will be completed. As funds become available, we will also complete the Memorial Park with wide walkways for handicapped elders and the children in the Montessori and Child Day Care. They will enjoy the nature trails, flower and vegetable gardens and the increasing number of birds and animals inhabiting the park. Several large memorial gifts honoring a loved one would complete the park sooner than expected.

Caring for the grateful elders is a constant source of amazement. In another letter I told you about Al, blind and practically homeless when he came to us in critical need of nourishing food to restore his health. When a staff member asked him one day if he wanted a second dessert, Al replied, "Yes, I do! I'm afraid this is just a dream and it might end if I wake up!"

I am always deeply touched when elders come to our little chapel to join me in asking God to bless our benefactors. They know that without your gifts the Heritage Living Center would not exist and their basic daily necessities – food, shelter and medical attention – would be unfulfilled. Thank you again for making this "miracle" possible.

I stand in awe when I reflect on the ways your generosity has saved the lives of elders who were suffering from malnutrition, lack of medical help and a warm, safe home. Your donations have become the gifts of life.

Viola E. Campeau, the Cheyenne Nightingale, Passes On

Viola Campeau, the beloved "Cheyenne Nightingale," died on January 20, 2004. For the past two years Viola enjoyed living in the Heritage Living Center where she had

many friends. Recently, Viola's friends and relatives were happy to see Viola's life highlighted in Father Emmett's recently published biography, Renegade Priest of the Northern Cheyenne.

Viola was born June 17, 1922 in Star Prairie County, Minnesota. After receiving her nursing degree, Viola accepted a Marquette Indian League volunteer placement to St. Labre Mission, where she renewed her yearly commitment until she felt it was truly her home.

On June 23,1970, Viola affiliated with the Province of St. Joseph of the Capuchin Order. In addition to her job teaching kindergarten, Viola opened a small clinic at St. Labre. No doctor came to the school and Viola averaged 60 patients a day including school students and ranch families. A devout Catholic, she nursed people

suffering from life-threatening burns, car accident injuries and diseases such as hepatitis, tuberculosis, meningitis, typhoid and cholera.

Viola endeared herself to the Northern Cheyenne and to area ranching families when she prayed with them at the death beds of relatives. Her soothing manner helped many to accept the death of their loved ones in tragic accidents or in lingering terminal illnesses. Viola dedicated all of her adult life to the poor and grieving.

Surrounded by her family and by the Northern Cheyenne people she loved, Viola was buried in the St. Labre Cemetary in Ashland on January 24, 2004. In lieu of

The Best of the Old-Time Frontier Interpreters

Frank Rowland likes to sit in the spacious front lobby of the Heritage Living Center. He seems engrossed in the morning newspaper, but he is also keeping his ears open to everything going on around him. To coin a cliché, Frank is "as sharp as a tack." Nothing gets by the last living grandson of famed frontier interpreter Willis Rowland. Perhaps this trait of remarkable awareness was handed down from his forefathers.

William Rowland, the first interpreter to make a name for himself among the Cheyennes, was born in 1830. A courageous, tough, Kentuckian, William married the daughter of a Cheyenne chief and proved himself in battles against the Pawnee fighting alongside his in-laws.

William and his growing family made their home at Fort Laramie where William served as interpreter. Later he moved to Fort Robinson, Nebraska to accept a similar position. After the Sioux War, William rendered his services during the tragic Cheyenne outbreak of 1879. George Bird Grinnell described William as "a fine type of prairie man — resourceful, without fear, and a good companion to travel with . . ." William later became one of the famous "Cheyenne Scouts" at Ft. Keogh under General Nelson Miles.

William had 8 sons and 2 daughters. His third son, Willis Thompson Rowland, (Long Forehead) took up his father's profession and served as official Cheyenne interpreter for many decades.

An interpreter's life was constantly fraught with danger as he rode the fence between cultures. If Willis made a mistake during treaty negotiations, his life was on the line. Historian and author Richard G. Hardorff said that Willis interpreted in a "... solid, and careful" manner like a "craftsman," making sure his vocabulary was precise in every "painstaking detail." Willis became friends and translated for George B. Grinnell, Thomas B. Marquis, George E. Hyde, Walter Camp, and many other writers who chronicled frontier history, including Indian interviews about the 1876 Battle of the Little Bighorn.

The only type of man who could have survived the difficult and precarious job of interpreter was a gentle, generous, fair-minded person. Frank remembers his Grandpa Willis as a good person who took in orphans and was kind to everyone, Indians and whites alike. Willis told his grandson: "If you have a visitor, feed him the best that you have. Make room for him to lie down and give him a blanket. If he needs clothing and food, make him comfortable. Never get mad at anybody." Grandpa Willis lived in a log cabin. The only sign that he had an important job was his Model A Ford.

Many interpreters came with the military and left with the military. Willis never left the Northern Cheyenne. His sons and nephews became interpreters, tribal judges and police

officers; respected men such as Chuck Rowland. Chuck served as Tribal Chairman for 16 years and led his people against the coal companies in the 1970s, after they illegally obtained coal leases to mine Cheyenne homelands.

Frank Rowland grew up in the shadow of great men. He attended Busby School and then worked in Wyoming on the railroad for years and spent time in Seattle and Anchorage, Alaska. Retired now, Frank and his dog, Simone, enjoy their new home at the Heritage Living Center. Frank is a welcome resident as he keeps everybody laughing. This is perhaps the most important survival trait handed down from the best of the old-time interpreters - men who could use humor to break the ice between cultures.



Renegade Priest of the Northern Cheyenne The Life and Work of Father Emmett Hoffmann 1926 –

"Who the hell are you working for, Father Emmett or me?" President John F. Kennedy's irate question came during a telephone conversation with U.S. Postmaster General, J. Edward Day, during the Cuban Missile Crisis.

Father Emmett was in Day's Washington office and overheard the loud argument. He felt like crawling out of the room.

The biography tells of young "Buddy" Hoffmann's childhood on his parents' Wisconsin dairy farm, where he baptized every farm animal in preparation for the priesthood. He dropped out of school twice and finally entered the seminary where his mischievous ways got him into trouble more than once.

After ordination, Father Emmett dreamed of an exotic post to Nicaragua. Instead, he was disappointed when he found out that his first post was to be St. Labre, a remote Montana mission.

Thus began Father's culture shock and re-education as he struggled to help the impoverished Northern Cheyenne, a tribe forgotten by the government. When Father first arrived, he found contaminated wells, murderous medical neglect, subhuman living conditions, rampant malnutrition and disease. How could he help these gentle, yet downtrodden people to regain the spirit of their proud ancestors?

His heartwarming story of dedication, success, temptation, failure, and renewal of spirit has been well received by readers across America.

Father Emmett's humanitarian efforts on behalf of the Northern Cheyenne is unequaled in the history of the Catholic Church in the 20th century American West. But success came at a terrible price. Father Emmett's remarkable humanity overcame the moral violence leveled against him by religious brethren, but not before it nearly cost him his life.

frontier women in the American West.




